

COLORED ROUNDELS

INSTALLATION GUIDE

Prior to installation:

- 1) Do not worry about making mistakes during the application process. In many cases there are spare roundel wedges on your sheet.
- 2) If you are applying roundels with any type of pattern (ie: wood, carbon, brushed aluminum) do not use the wedges that are right next to each other, rather the opposing roundel wedges, so that the pattern direction matches.
- 3) When installing, be careful not to stretch the vinyl by pulling on it or lifting it too often. If it stretches it will not fit properly.
- 4) we recommend that you begin the application process by installing the wheel roundels first, as they will be the least visible, and in most cases you will have the most spare wedges for the wheels.

TOOL REQUIRED: A flat blade to rest the roundel wedge on while applying. (knife, box cutter or flathead screwdriver)

Be sure to wash your vehicle's roundels with soap and water to remove any dirt and oil. This will help the vinyl stick to the roundel.

- 1) Carefully peel a wedge from the backing and stick a tiny portion of it onto the knife. Use the knife to carefully put the right angle corner of the vinyl onto the appropriate place on the roundel, being careful not to cover any chrome, and to cover all the blue.
- 2) Once the decal is in place, if you notice that it was not put on correctly by just a little, rub the roundel with your finger tip to stretch it. Even though it is applied, it does not completely adhere to the roundel surface for a few minutes. You can stretch the vinyl slightly so it covers the area you require.
- 3) If your vinyl is stick to the wrong area and it cannot be stretched to cover the appropriate area, use your finger nail to remove it and try again using one of the spares in the same size. Do not use a sharp implement to remove the wedge as it will most likely scratch your roundel surface. Be sure to note how many spares you have before beginning.

All roundels are non-permanent and can be removed at any time.

To choose the correct roundels, locate your vehicle in the list below. Cross reference the corresponding number for the front, rear and side roundel (where applicable) to the diagram of the roundel circles.

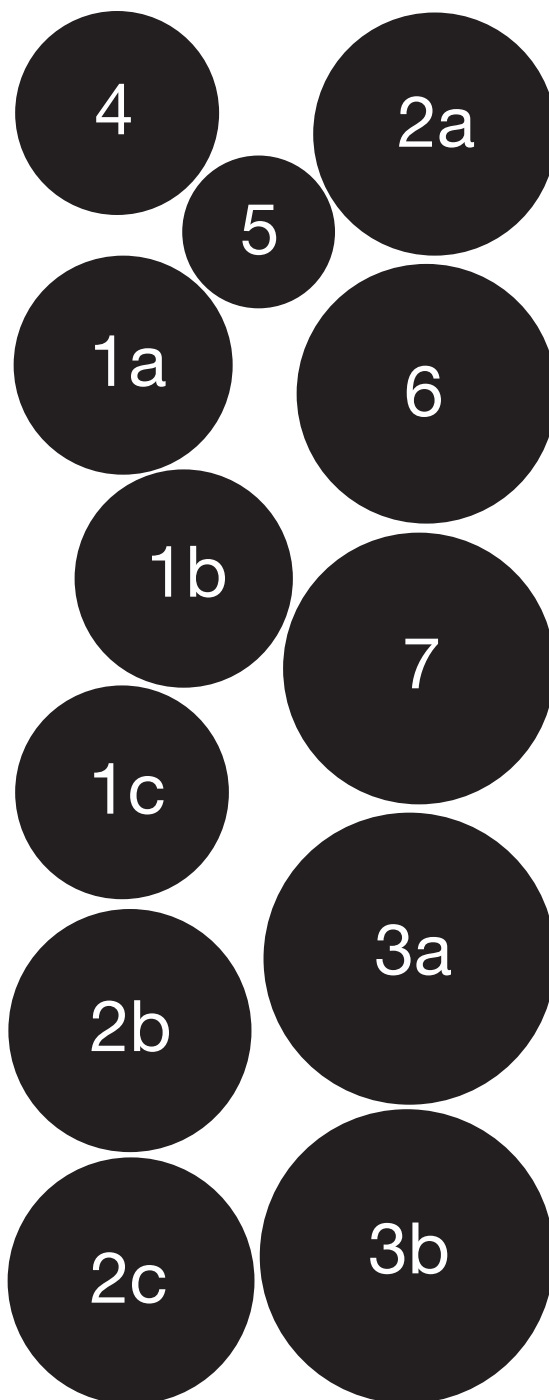
This diagram is a replica of the actual roundel sheet and will allow you to locate your required roundels by identifying their location here.

Numbers 1, 2 and 3 have multiples on the sheet labelled with "a,b,c". Any one of these letters can be used as they are the same size.

IF YOUR VEHICLE IS NOT LISTED USE TRAIL AND ERROR TO DETERMINE THE CORRECT ROUNDELS FOR EACH LOCATION.
